



Snow Days Home Learning Activities Sheet 1.

Over the next few days the nursery staff will suggest some activities you can do at home if the nursery is closed. Please use post-its, pieces of paper and photographs to record your child's response and learning during the activities. Bring them to nursery so that your child can share them with their key worker and stick them into their learning journal. Keep the activities short and fun and suited to your child's interests. Thank you for your support.

Personal Social and Emotional Development:

Make a record of how people are feeling about the snow especially ask your child how they are feeling. It may be a picture or just a sentence you can record for them. It might look like this.....

I am excited because I want to make a snow angel or

I am sad because I wanted to play with my friends at nursery

How many different ways do people feel about the snow? Are the adult answers different from children's answers?

Forest School Ideas:

There are lots of things you can do if you wrap up warmly and go outside to play in the snow. Look at www.naturedetectives.org.uk website for some ideas and activity sheets to print off. Take a photograph of snowangels and snowmen for your learning journey. When you talk about it with your family and key worker you will be developing your memory and recall skills as well as vocabulary and language skills.

You can still do some outside activities from inside in the warmth. Look out through a window and watch for birds. Where are they finding food and sleeping? Can you see tracks in the snow? Who or what made them? What looks different? Make a note of your answers for your learning journal.
